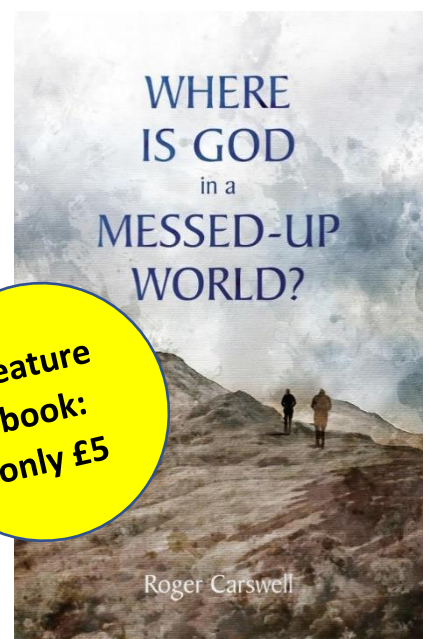

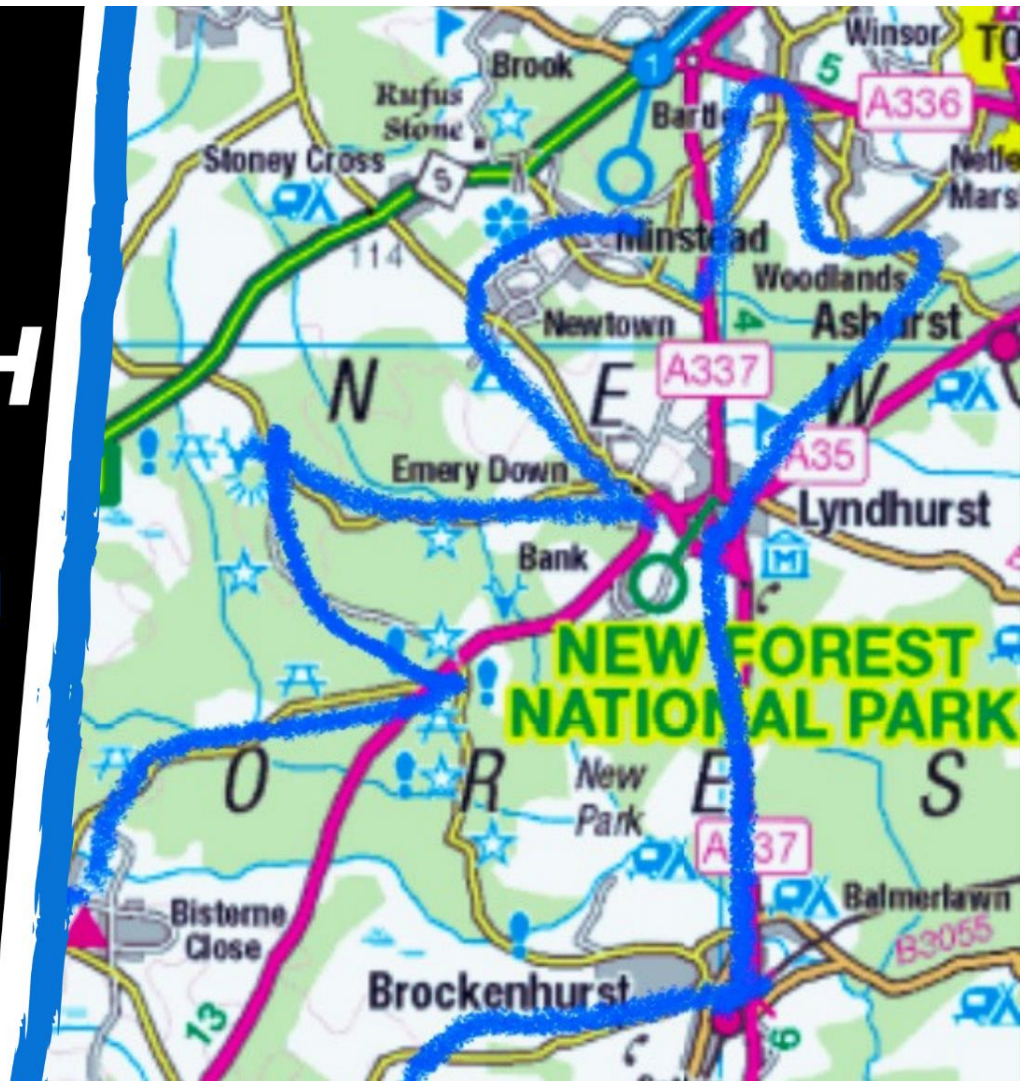

We're very keen that we make the most of our new freedoms, whilst making sure that everyone feels safe. This is what has been agreed by the PCCs of Bransgore and Hinton Admiral to begin on Sunday the 25th. Key to the success of this is that we all try to be aware of the safety and feelings of others.

MASK WEARING

Mask wearing will be optional, with a strong encouragement for those who wish to continue to wear a mask to do so. You are free to sit anywhere in Church, but there will be a zone at the back of each Church reserved for those who wish to remain socially distant and wear a mask. The reason for the zone being at the back of the Church is due to the resumption of communal singing.

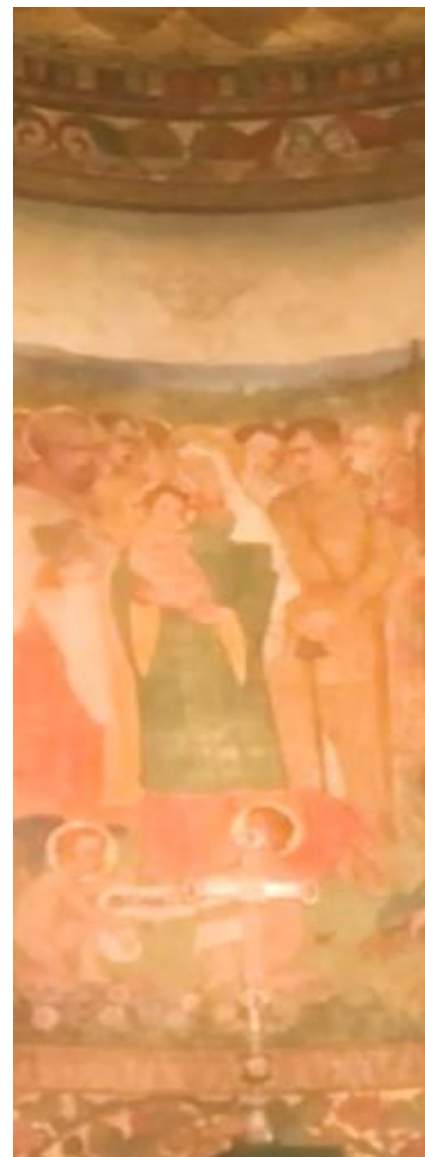


Singing

All churches to resume singing without a requirement to wear a mask. You are, of course, free not to sing or to sing with a mask too. The 8am Communion service at St Mary' Bransgore is commended as a service without singing, which also has plenty of space for social distancing.

Communion

All services will offer communion in both kinds: bread and wine. At our larger services (9.00 Hinton and 4pm Bransgore) three options for Communion will be available: bread alone; bread and wine from a common cup; bread intincted/dipped in a different cup which will not be drunk directly from. At the smaller services - Communion at All Saints and at the 8am Bransgore - worshippers are offered the choice of receiving bread alone or also receiving wine from a cup which will be both dipped and drunk from directly.
